SECRETARY'S REPORT

Formal Report for the Year

The Committee met formally four times this year and held several one issue calls regarding the 2020 festival culminating in the hard decision to cancel the festival. The main areas of discussion over the year has been:

- Resignation of the Chair and appointment of a new Chair
- 2020 Festival and preparations for the 2021 festival
- BCC Website
- Trophy and old stock item audit
- Operation of the membership application process and rules
- Routine Membership, financial and Eel reporting updates

As there was no AGM in 2020 the committee undertook two votes by email that required membership approval. One for election of a new club Chair and one on a change to the membership process. As a result of those votes we can now make the following formal club announcements:

Announcement Under Rule 2 - Business of the Club:

Dave Ball has been elected to serve as club Chair for a term of three years from 1 December 2020.

Announcement Under Rule 3 - The President:

As is the tradition of the club, the outgoing Chair Paul Sweetman has been appointed as President for a period of 3 years from 1 December 2020.

Announcement of a change in Rule 7&8 Membership & Qualification:

Rule 7 MEMBERSHIP: to the British Conger Club shall comprise: – **Full** and **Junior** member categories. All applications for, and admission to, the British Conger Club will be at the discretion of the Committee. The British Conger Club also has several Life members. The British Conger Club will allow existing Life members to retain their membership in this category, but from July 2017 will cease to offer this category of membership and will not instate further Life members.

Rule 8. ANGLERS SEEKING Membership: may be admitted to the club on the submission of a completed membership form and payment of the membership fee appropriate at the time of application.

The rule changes noted above mean that club Bye Laws 1 QUALIFICATION FOR FULL MEMBERSHIP & 2 ASSOCIATE MEMBERS are no longer relevant. These Bye Laws will now be removed from the Rules and Bye Laws of the club.



Looking to the Future – Musings On Moving The Club Forward

Aside from a vastly increased level of knowledge on viruses, hand washing, face mask efficacy and the ability to assess transmission risk in an instant as I walk down the seafront or go shopping I found myself pondering what did 2020 do for me?

Despite cancelations due to lockdowns and weather I still managed to have some fantastic fishing in 2020, but like a lot of members I did miss the BCC festival. A conversation with a club member on a trip in September made me think about what the festival means to people – it's not just the fishing it's the AGM, meeting up with people new members and old friends, the friendly rivalry and of course the on board and in the bar banter.

The festival for some may be the only time they get together or interact with fellow club members. There are of course members who fish together outside of the festival but not having the festival this year did make me think that maybe we need to think about a wider range of club activities.

At the moment I'm not sure what that would look like – maybe an additional competition that encourages members to fish together – a pairs competition over 2 days even if it's from different ports maybe linking it with the Interport Competition. Or booking trips aimed at club members only – possibly looking for that personal best or targeting some of the clubs trophies. As I say at the moment I'm not sure what these additional activities might look like. Something that gives us another couple of club related trips a year to supplement the festival and get members fishing together more often seems like a good idea to me.

I'd certainly be grateful for views on whether members would be interested in additional activities and any ideas people may have on how we might facilitate that.

The rule changes that have recently been made on membership to the club have primarily been made to facilitate a growth in membership. Whilst the changes made have been broadly welcomed and approved of by members there is no doubt that the dropping of the qualifying fish requirement has felt like a loss to some who see it as a recognition of achievement. Given that we all like a little recognition of our angling prowess the committee has discussed the possibility of introducing badges to acknowledge and celebrate members achievements.

The basic thinking is that we would award cloth badges to recognise members catches starting with a 40lb+ then 50lb+ etc. up-to 100lb+. This would allow members to show their achievement as well as giving some kudos and of course that little bit of friendly competition between members.

Your feedback on whether you feel that might be worth exploring further would be welcomed.

As officers of the club we will do all we can to ensure a safe and successful Festival including the addition of a 6th boat to reduce numbers. We will continue to monitor the situation and keep you informed.

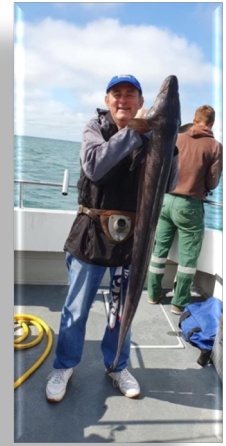

BCC EVENTS - 2021:

Personal Members' Boat Festival and AGM: This will take place in Weymouth on the weekend of Saturday 3 and Sunday 4 July. COMPETITIONS AND TROPHIES

Interport Competition: This annual competition for teams of two runs from 1 June to 30 September and is very simple to enter. All you need to do is inform our **Records Officer Paul Maris** or **Club Secretary Paul Milkins** before your day of fishing and provide the following details:

- Names of both anglers
- Fishing date
- Boat name and port to be fished from

After the trip all you need to do is let the Records Officer know the weights of your individual best eels. Only one entry per year is allowed for this competition, but if your trip is cancelled you can let the Records Officer know and retry another time.

Shore Competition: This competition runs from 1 October to 30 November. You can fish anywhere from the shore at any time during this period and send in your entry in the usual way but make sure you ask for the fish to be entered into the Shore Competition.

Geoff Flores Bronze Trophy: This trophy is awarded annually to the BCC member who catches and releases the highest number of Conger Eels over the given year. An entry form is attached at the end of this newsletter. Complete this and send to **Records Officer Paul Maris** at the end of the year.

Thompson Medal Awards: These are awarded annually to paid up Members for capture of Conger Eels in the following weight categories:

Boat Captured

55lbs and over – Bronze
65lbs and over - Silver
75lbs and over – Gold

Shore Captured

25lbs and over – Bronze
35lbs and over – Silver
45lbs and over - Gold

You can win only one of these a year. If you are fortunate enough to catch more than one medal category fish, you will receive the appropriate medal for your best eel. You will need to supply capture details and photographic evidence to **Records Officer Paul Maris** to be eligible. To supply details you will need to complete one of the club's Specimen Fish Entry forms.

TOM MATCHETT



The Chairman's address at every AGM includes a moment of silence for any members who have passed away during the previous year.

The Covid Pandemic robbed us of this chance to reflect on memories of friends we will no longer be able to fish with.

Around the time the 2020 AGM should have taken place the news of Toms death was posted on the members only Facebook page, where he was described as a "Stalwart of the club". This hardly seems to do justice to someone who devoted 27 years of his life to our club.

Tom was born in 1930 in Derbyshire. After serving in the Royal Navy he moved to Plymouth in 1954 to become a Butcher in Cawsand on the Rame Peninsular.

Clearly a man with the sea and fishing in his blood, in 1958 he became a member of the Plymouth Co-op SAC,

becoming Chairman of the Plymouth Federation in 1962. He was involved in the Bass Festival and instrumental in setting up the Plymouth International Sea Angling Festival.

In 1974 Tom joined the BCC and between then and 1979 was a committee member and fish recorder, he was Chairman from 1979 to 1987 and secretary from 1987 till 2001. Sadly he had to retire from this post due to ill health. During all this service he was also closely involved with EFSA representing the English section on 20 occasions and winning 2 gold medals.

Described as a straight talker who didn't suffer fools easily, he was ever quick to encourage youngsters to get involved in angling, a talent that is sorely needed these days. I would suggest we will struggle to see his like again.

Toms ashes were fittingly put into the sea off Rame Head.

One thing I discovered while searching for details about him was Tom's membership number, it was number one. I can pay him no greater tribute.
